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Information for parents / carers

Your child's reading journey Reception Summer term



We are now over two thirds of the way through your child's first year at school! We hope you have seen the huge progress that your child has made in reading. The children have learned the Phase 2 and Phase 3 sounds and are at various stages of learning to blend sounds to read words. It is really important to remember that learning to read comes more quickly to some children than others. We are here to help all children learn to read and will provide your child with extra help if they need it. In Reception this term, we will be teaching Phase 4 which is all about consolidating and improving their phonetic knowledge, while introducing trickier words with increased vocabulary. Your child will begin to read two-syllable words as well as reading and spelling some tricky words. In Phase 4, no new graphemes (sounds) are introduced. The main aim of this phase is to consolidate the children's knowledge and to help them learn to read and spell words which have adjacent consonants eg. **trap, string** and **milk.**

What will my child be taught in school this term?

- This term, phonics lessons run for 20–30 minutes daily.
- Your child will recap the Phase 2 and Phase 3 digraphs and trigraphs on their own and in words.
- They will continue to be taught the tricky words that they will read in their books.
- They will be reading either Phase 2 or Phase 3 decodable books, depending on where they are most secure. Your child will only read books containing sounds they are confident with.
