



Bridgewater Primary School Sports Premium Allocation and Impact 2023-2024

Sport Premium Grant Background

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The purpose of the funding is that schools will have to spend the sport funding in improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Accountability Schools will be held to account for how they spend the sport funding.

It is a requirement to publish the percentage of children who passed the KS2 swimming proficiency tests at the end of each year. This includes the following assessment criteria:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- use a range of strokes effectively - for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations

In the academic year 2023-2024, 88% (51/58) of pupils passed.

At Bridgewater Primary School, we have been allocated £19410 for the financial year 2023-2024. As a school we intend on using the money to develop children's and teacher's skills within the P.E curriculum. The following tables outlines the spend of the pupil premium money and it's impact.
