
A message from Mrs Henderson

This term in nursery has been full of exciting learning experiences. We explored numbers 4 and 5, practicing counting, recognition, and formation through engaging games, songs, and hands-on activities. As part of our winter topic, the children learned about the changing seasons, discussed cold weather, and experimented with ice to observe how it melts. We also celebrated Chinese New Year by creating dragon crafts, learning about traditions, and even trying some traditional dancing. Our superhero theme sparked imagination as the children thought about bravery, kindness, and the special powers they would love to have. To end the term with excitement, we dived into the world of the circus, where the children enjoyed balancing, juggling, and pretending to be clowns and acrobats. We started by learning about 'Winter'. We learned about the seasonal changes and enjoyed reading 'The Snowman' by Raymond Briggs.

Our favourite part of the topic was playing outside in the snow! We then moved on to learning about 'Chinese New Year'. We read the Chinese Zodiac story and produced some lovely writing and artwork based on the topic. We were lucky enough to participate in a Chinese dance workshop, where we learned some traditional Chinese dance movements, using dragon and lion heads.

For our final topic of the half term, we learned about 'Celebrations'. We loved learning about different types of celebrations and how people celebrate differently. We enjoyed our Riveting Reads session where we got to share the book 'We're going to a Birthday Party' and complete lots of birthday themed activities with our parents and carers.

In History, Year 1 are enjoying learning about differences between the past and present. They had a great time on their visit to Salford Museum, where they learnt about life in the Victorian times and had the opportunity to play with Victorian toys and wash up in the style of a Victorian.

Linked to their History learning, they have produced some amazing poems based on the book Lost in the Toy Museum.

In Science, the children have been learning about birds and plants. We began our experiment all about what a plant needs to survive. They have loved producing artwork based on this theme.
























Year 3


Year 3 have had an extremely busy half term. In Geography the children have been learning about Volcanoes and Tsunamis. The children have learnt about the different types of volcanoes and tectonic plates. In Science, the children have been learning about Rocks and Soils. The children have categorised the rocks into permeable, natural and manmade rocks. In P.E the children have had the pleasure of been taught dance by Miss Jasmine. In Art with Miss Pickup, the children have been looking at the artist Hokusai.






Year 4



This half term in English, Year 4 have been immersing themselves in The Paradise Garden to help them to write a diary entry as the main character. The children have also written a poem linked to their History unit of Anglo-Saxons. In Maths, we have been learning about written methods for multiplication and division, as well as measuring length and perimeter. In Science, we have been learning about Sound and Hearing including how sound waves travel. We have also created our own sequence of music on digital software. Year 4 have been historical detectives to find out which Anglo-Saxon King was buried at Sutton Hoo and have learnt what it was like to be a child during the Anglo-Saxon era. Both Year 4 classes have been strengthening their hockey skills in PE. Finally, Year 4 have created torches with their own electrical circuits in D&T. We hope you have a lovely break.










Year 5

Year 5 have had a wonderful start to 2025. We have been reading the text 'Holes' by Louis Sachar and we have enjoyed drafting a variety of different text types such as an opening to a narrative and a letter. We have been working hard to master multiplication and division in Maths and we continue to develop the speed of our Mental Maths Skills. In Science, we have been exploring properties of materials and have taken part in a fun investigation about how temperature changes the rate in which a material dissolves. We have been learning lots of new gymnastic skills in PE and we improved our computing skills by creating formulas in spreadsheets. During our History topic, we've been learning about the Ancient Egyptians and during Art Week we explored the Amazon Rainforest and created some fabulous sketching's, prints and paintings. In Spanish, we have learnt how to discuss the different school subjects and discuss what we like or dislike and why.







Year 6

Year 6 have had a busy start to 2025 and have been continuing their hard work. They have shown excellent resilience in their practice assessments this term. In English, the children have been using the text 'The Island' by Armin Greder to inspire their writing. They have written brilliant narratives. They have also produced powerful, emotive reverse poems linking to the theme of discrimination within the text. In Maths, they have continued to develop their arithmetic skills as well as exploring fractions, decimals and percentages and applying this to problem solving questions. In D.T, they have shown excellent creativity in designing and constructing a playground. In Geography, they have become confident in using an atlas to explore the UK. In their Science lessons, they have been exploring light and have investigated how shadows are formed and what causes shadows to change size. Year 6 have also enjoyed a visit to Walkden Library where they explored the variety of books. Many of our Year 6s are excited to become a member and loan books from the library to enjoy reading at home.

This half term, we have celebrated Children's Mental Health Week. Children took part in activities in their classrooms, learned about ways to support one another in their assemblies and discussed ways to talk about worries with trusted adults.
